It comes after the nursery group received a gift of bug spotting and gardening tools from Annington, the company refurbishing homes at The Crescent in Windsor, just in time for the Big Butterfly

The children at Always Growing Nursery got to work counting butterflies and moths activities like gardening is in their outdoor space thanks to their new garden resource kit provided by Annington. The donation equipped the children with trowels, rakes, shovels and spades and wildlife-watching equipment. For the zoophiles, magnifying glasses helped to identify the critters up close feasting on flowers and shrubbery, while binoculars were used to watch incoming birds swoop down and gobble up any unearthed insects for dinner.

This donation marks the Big Butterfly Count 2024. which will be held between the Friday, July 12, and will run until Sunday, August 4. Held annually each summer, the count is a UK-wide survey which aims to helping us assess the health of the environment by counting the amount and type of butterflies we can see. Launched in 2010, the count has rapidly become one of the world's biggest survey of butterflies.
