Pupils enjoy updated library space at Netheravon school



A PRIMARY school library has been given a fresh look and new lease of life.

The library at All Saints C of E School in Netheravon, Wiltshire, was refurbished thanks to a donation from housing re-developers Annington, creating a more engaging and comfortable learning environment for pupils.

The upgraded space now features modern bookshelves, bean bags and new furnishings, designed to inspire a love of reading and support the school's educational goals.
